WOMEN'S* HEALTH.

We're talking about it. Are you?





The notation **Women*** should reflect that there are more than the two genders of male and female. Genders are also socially created and appropriated; the social gender is not a natural phenomenon.

Our services are open to all women*.

About 17,000 women currently live with HIV in Germany, of whom around 2,200 don't know about their infection.

Worldwide, more women* than men are affected by HIV and AIDS.

Talking about HIV/AIDS is difficult for most people, regardless of age, gender, origin, religion, or sexual orientation. Through our work, we know how important it is to talk about sexual health. You too could be affected by HIV and other sexually transmitted infections (STIs).

Get advice if you have any questions about sexual health!

Every woman* decides for herself if and when she wants to take an HIV test. Early diagnosis enables timely treatment and prevents AIDS. There are many good reasons to take an HIV test: after risky exposure, at the beginning of a new relationship, or if you want to have children or are pregnant. All pregnant women in Germany are offered an HIV test. If an HIV infection is detected, transmission from mother to child can be prevented by antiretroviral therapy.

Anonymous HIV and STI tests are offered by many Aidshilfe services and health authorities in Baden-Württemberg.
